



Eucalypt Garden Memorial

EUCALYPT GARDEN MEMORIALS

These positions are placed in a kidney-shaped garden bed set amongst tall gum trees, native grasses and ground covers echoing the natural unity between the cemetery and its surrounding environment. Companion Memorials are able to accommodate up to two (2) interments, and the Rock Memorials in the garden are family memorials for up to four (4) interments. Memorial plaques can be added on top of a brown or grey granite desk.

HEALESVILLE CEMETERY



A SCENIC CEMETERY

Mount Riddell provides a stunning backdrop to the picturesque grounds of the Healesville Cemetery. The cemetery with its mix of flowing lawns and historic headstones complements the wild, natural beauty of the surrounding environment — the result being a natural setting looking on to beautiful mountain vistas including Mount Monda and Mount St. Leonard.

BURIALS

NATURAL BURIALS

The north-eastern corner of the cemetery has been specially designated as an area solely for natural burials. This eco-friendly option is growing in popularity as people and communities become more aware of their 'ecological footprint'.

In a natural burial, the intention is to leave a minimal impact on the landscape and this is achieved by the deceased individual being placed into a biodegradable coffin made of natural materials such as sustainably-harvested, untreated timber. Alternatively, in-lieu of a coffin, the deceased may be wrapped in a simple shroud. As an alternative to a headstone or monument, all names and memorial inscriptions are placed on a commemorative boulder.

Cremation Memorial

LAWN GRAVES

Healesville Cemetery provides the modern option of lawn burial set amongst the native landscape and historic headstone monuments. The two main options are for a grave (1) with a concrete beam on which the plaque can be mounted, or (2) without a beam as shown above. Plaques may also be attached to a concrete or granite desk in small, medium or large sizes.

MONUMENTAL GRAVES

These graves allow for the installation of a solid and impressive stone monument that covers the length and breadth of the grave in place of grassed lawn. Usually made from granite or marble, these monuments are created in conjunction with your choice of stonemason.

VAULT GRAVES

Vaults are special graves that are fully lined with concrete walls and floor allowing for the coffin to be encapsulated and protected from direct contact with the earth. Like monumental graves, they also have the capacity to accommodate a solid and impressive stone monument.

MEMORIALS

SCATTERING MEMORIALS

'Tharangilkbek' is a beautiful area set in the south-western corner of the cemetery reserved for the scattering of cremated remains. Scattering is an option where the ashes of the deceased person are spread topically over the land and around the trees, allowing for the natural return of elements to the earth. The area is named after the Aboriginal word meaning "Promenade for the blessed dead". The memorial includes a nameplate on a commemorative boulder.
