## ABOUT THIS DOCUMENT:

During 2015/2016 The Greater Metropolitan Cemetery Trust (GMCT) developed a series of short histories as part of its obligations under the Public Records Act 1973. The documents focus on the administrative history of each cemetery, providing a range of information which may be useful to researchers, including a brief historical overview, timeline and bibliography. GMCT gratefully acknowledges the work of Dr Jan Penney and Sarah Hurley in the development of this document.

**Cemeteries are controlled by a Trust appointed by the Governor in Council on the recommendation of the responsible Minister. The Greater Metropolitan Cemeteries Trust is a Class A Trust and a body corporate with perpetual succession established by the Governor in Council pursuant to regulations under the *Cemeteries Act 1958* and updated within the *Cemeteries and Crematoria Act 2003*. The Trust is responsible for the maintenance of the cemetery, the handling of funds and the erection of monuments. Core services include internment in graves, internment in mausolea, internment of cremated remains, cremations, venue hire, hospitality, memorialisation, perpetual maintenance, archival cemetery and genealogical records and community events.**

From 1864 to August 1873 The Commissioner of Public Works and the Public Works Department were responsible for cemeteries including the appointment of Trustees and fees charged (VRG28). From 1873 to 1888 The Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey and the Department of Crown Lands and Survey were responsible (VG18). In 1888 the Chief Secretary and his Department (VRG26) were in control of cemeteries, but in 1890 the Minister for Health and the Department of Public Health (VRG39) become responsible under the Public Health Act 1889 – 53 (Vic No:1044).<sup>1</sup> In 1944 the new Ministry of Health Act (1943) and the Cemeteries Act 1944 (5025) saw the Minister for Health and the Department of Health become the responsible entity.<sup>2</sup> On 1 January 2015 the Department of Health and Human Services was formed, integrating the Department of Health and the Department of Human Services Sport and Recreation.

In 2002 the government initiated a Report on the financial viability of Cemetery Trusts which raised a number of concerns over the viability, financial management and governance of some cemeteries.<sup>3</sup> In 2004 The Department of Human Services was advised of concerns related to probity at some cemeteries and the Auditor General completed a review which was reported to Parliament in May 2005.<sup>4</sup> As a result the Minister for Health requested the Auditor General to widen the Review to include all major cemeteries<sup>5</sup> Government then initiated a review of the major cemetery trusts under section 50 of the Public Services Act (relating largely to the governance and effectiveness of the cemetery sector as a whole) which was undertaken by the State Services Authority and tabled in Parliament in June 2007.<sup>6</sup>

In July 2008 the State Government announced reforms to the fourteen major metropolitan and regional Cemetery Trusts that report to Parliament.<sup>7</sup> Two major metropolitan Trusts were created, the Southern Metropolitan Cemeteries Trust, and the Greater Metropolitan Cemeteries Trust, three regional Class A Trusts and five other Trusts. Another major review of the five Class A Trusts was completed in May 2013 to ensure that the reforms were proceeding smoothly.<sup>8</sup>

Greater Metropolitan Cemeteries Trust was formed in 2010 and assumed responsibility for twenty cemetery sites.<sup>9</sup>

**Keilor Cemetery** is administered by the State Government through an independent Trust Board, the Greater Metropolitan Cemeteries Trust, Class A, established in 2010.<sup>10</sup>

Keilor Cemetery covers 14 hectares and is a suburb north-west of Melbourne.<sup>11</sup> It offers burial services and commemoration and memorialisation for cremated remains.<sup>12</sup> It has a large number of Italian Catholic and Greek orthodox style memorials, and a Mausoleum, which opened in April 2008.<sup>13</sup> The cemetery also includes pioneer graves with surrounding landscaped spaces and lawn graves.<sup>14</sup>

Keilor Cemetery opened in 1856, with the first burial taking place on April 28 of the same year.<sup>15</sup> The earliest recorded memorialisation was for Ellen Blanche Bonfield, who died of infantile fever. Keilor cemetery is also the resting place of pioneer families, the notorious gangland boss, Carl Williams, and those lying in unmarked graves, including the alleged remains of Harriet, a 22 year old Indigenous woman. There is no certainty, however, as to the occupants of graves prior to 1925, as the original Keilor Cemetery register has been lost.<sup>16</sup>

The first Trustees of Keilor Cemetery were appointed by the Governor-in-Council on 20 October 1857.<sup>17</sup> Each Trust member was a local citizen who represented the various religious denominations, which came to include a Roman Catholic section by 23 February 1863.<sup>18</sup> The Shire of Keilor took over as Trustees on 17 June 1925.<sup>19</sup> Trusteeship was transferred to the Brimbank City Council, which superseded the Shire of Keilor Council, on 14 December 1994, and continued in this appointment until its incorporation into the Greater Metropolitan Cemeteries Trust in January 2010.<sup>20</sup>

The City Council had early and continuous involvement in the maintenance of Keilor Cemetery, even before its official Trusteeship. On the request of the Health Department, Keilor Council elected a Trust member for the Keilor Cemetery on 24 February 1912.<sup>21</sup> In July 1925 and, again, in November 1954, staff reorganisation within Keilor Shire Council led to further appointments of council employees to the Trust.<sup>22</sup>

The most significant re-appointment was in June 1997 with the replacement of all Keilor Cemetery Trust members with new Brimbank City Councillors, in accordance with section 86 of the Local Government Act 1989.<sup>23</sup> This occurred after the Keilor Cemetery Trust became a separate legal entity from Brimbank City Council on 14 May 1996.<sup>24</sup>

Keilor Cemetery Trust acquired additional land to be developed for future interments and memorialisation and commemoration purposes.<sup>25</sup> The Trust first purchased an additional 14 acres and 32 perches, situated north-west of the cemetery, on 29 June 1883.<sup>26</sup> No further purchases were made until 1960, when the Keilor Cemetery Trust established a burial place for the Slovenian community, on the request of Fr Basil Valetin. Between June 1989 and August 1996, surrounding land east of Keilor Cemetery was acquired, as well as a portion of Brimbank Park, totalling 9.9875 hectares.<sup>28</sup>

As the community north-west of Melbourne rapidly expanded from the mid-1980s onwards, Keilor Cemetery Trust aimed to ensure the cemetery remained open.<sup>29</sup> On 29 January 1985, additional land was purchased on the north-west corner of Cemetery Road and Calder Highway.<sup>30</sup> Acquisition of the Webber Parade Properties on 25 October 1994 also supported cemetery expansion.<sup>31</sup> Finally, both in 2001 and, later, in 2004, land was developed north of Keilor Cemetery.<sup>32</sup>

Keilor Cemetery is now administered by the government through an independent Trust Board, the Greater Metropolitan Cemeteries Trust, established in 2010.<sup>33</sup>

**Keilor Cemetery Timeline**

- 1856 April - Keilor Cemetery opened<sup>35</sup>
- 1856 April 28 - Earliest recorded burial held at Keilor Cemetery for the remains of Ellen Blanche Bonfield, who died of Synochus (infantile fever).<sup>36</sup> Many pioneer families, including early arrivals from Ireland, Scotland and England, and many from the goldfields of Ballarat and Bendigo are also buried at Keilor<sup>37</sup>
- 1856 November 11 - Approved plan for an oval shaped cemetery on the Keilor Reserve, consisting of ten acres and divided by denominations<sup>38</sup>
- 1857 October 20 - Trustees appointed for the ground set apart at Keilor as a site for a general cemetery<sup>39</sup>
- 1869 June 5 - Appointed Trustees of Keilor Cemetery represented the various denominations (Roman Catholic, Protestant, and Church of England)<sup>40</sup>
- 1869 July 29 - Death of Harriet, a 22 year old Indigenous woman of the Jim Crowe tribe, who died of Pulmonary Consumption in Keilor, while passing through with her grandmother<sup>41</sup> Allegations that Harriet is buried in an unmarked grave at Keilor Cemetery, although there is no record in the burial registers.<sup>42</sup> There are many pauper graves at Keilor<sup>43</sup>
- 1869 August 28 - Trustees of Keilor cemetery request a subdivision of Keilor cemetery<sup>44</sup>
- 1870 August 26 - Rules and Regulations of the Keilor Cemetery published in the Victorian Government Gazette<sup>45</sup>
- 1872 March 22 - Trustees appointed for the land set apart on 23 February 1863 for a Roman Catholic section at Keilor Cemetery<sup>46</sup>
- 1872 November 23 - Proposal to construct a road past Keilor Cemetery that joins with Mount Alexander Road, at the junction of Foster’s Road<sup>47</sup>
- 1883 June 29 - 14 acres and 32 perches of additional land acquired, north-west of the Keilor Cemetery<sup>48</sup>
- 1912 February 24 - Keilor Council elected a Trust member for the Keilor Cemetery, on request by the Department of Health<sup>49</sup>
- 1925 The original Keilor Cemetery register listing all burials prior to 1925 no longer exists.<sup>50</sup> Research done by Angela Evans and the Keilor Pioneer Research Collective have uncovered at least 60 burials in the period between 1856 and 1870<sup>51</sup>
- 1925 June 17 - Keilor Cemetery Trust consisted of local citizens up until 1925, when the Shire of Keilor was appointed as Trustees of Keilor Cemetery by the Governor-in-Council<sup>52</sup>
