Request for grave top up

Grave subsidence refers to the appearance of graves 'sinking'. This is an entirely natural process caused by loosened soil settling into place. Grave subsidence is a process that GMCT regularly manages and rectifies, and it should not be cause for concern. **You can report an incidence of grave subsidence to GMCT by filling out the details below.**

You do not need to fill out all of the fields, but please provide as much information as possible. This will assist GMCT in identifying the location and topping up the grave.
