

YARRA VALLEY MAUSOLEUM

The Yarra Valley Mausoleum is the only mausoleum serving the communities of the greater eastern region. It blends tradition, culture and prestige with the beauty of the local landscape. An open-plan design was decided on in consultation with the local community and brings you and your family close to nature with views across the hills. The eastern side is planted with fragrant, trellised wisteria and native grasses and there is a beautiful olive grove on the western side. Single, double, and tandem crypts are available.

MONUMENTAL GRAVES

This formal and traditional form of remembrance is a solid and impressive stone monument usually made from granite or marble. The monuments can be created in conjunction with your choice of stonemason. Please note the purchase of the grave does not include the construction of the monument.

CHAPEL COMPLEX

The Federation Chapel is built on a ridge overlooking the surrounding hills and vineyards and boasts spectacular views. Services in the chapel can seat 140 people, or up to 380 via video-link into the adjacent areas. On-site catering is provided in the Candlebark Function Room, and can host functions of up to 340 people when used in conjunction with the North and Melba rooms.

LILYDALE MEMORIAL PARK



GROWING WITH THE COMMUNITY

Lilydale Memorial Park has a long and proud history of meeting the diverse and growing needs of the community dating back to 1863 when the first burial was conducted at the original Lilydale Lawn Cemetery. This cemetery served these early pioneering communities for many years before reaching capacity, at which time a new site was sought. A short distance of 1km further along Victoria Road a suitable site was located and the Lilydale Memorial Park was established.

Now the location of the GMCT's Eastern Regional Office, Lilydale Memorial Park conducts approximately 2200 burial and cremations services per annum. The crematorium and mausoleum are the only facilities of their type serving this area of Eastern Victoria.

CREMATED REMAINS INTERMENTS

Cooring Yering has double positions in a raised garden bed around a gum tree and are located near the rotunda within the memorial rose garden. The **Melba Rose Garden** (pictured) has double positions bordering rose beds. Cremated remains are interred in the lawns to prevent damage to the plants' roots. If you prefer interment of ashes in a garden bed, the **Granite Edge** memorials are double positions among flowering gums and native plantings, bordered by granite edging.

VINE OF REMEMBRANCE

This memorial comprises coloured bronze plaques representing the leaves of a gilded vine carved into red granite. The Vine of Remembrance commemorates loved ones whose ashes have been scattered, or who have been interred at another location.

LAWN GRAVES

PLAQUE / BEAM

Located in **Manna Gum Gardens**, **Paperbark Lawn** and **Yarra Gum Lawn**, the lawn graves have a single plaque on a concrete beam and can accommodate up to three interments. (Plaques with detachable plates can be chosen to accommodate second and third interments.) Four interments of cremated remains may be placed with burials.

GRANITE DESKTOP & HEADSTONE

Traditional headstones and angled granite bases are available. Granite desktops can accommodate masonry inscription or a single plaque. (Plaques with detachable plates can be chosen for graves with more than one interment.) The **Pavilion Lawn** has desktop positions for up to three interments. **Yellow Gum Garden** accommodates traditional headstones for two interments and desktop headstones for three interments.

NATURAL BURIALS & SCATTERING OF ASHES

The **Djeernongs Walk** was named after an Aboriginal word for "pathway" or "many footprints". This area is for eco-friendly natural burials (single interments only) and the scattering of cremated remains.
